Luke 5:12-16 (ESV)

¹² While he was in one of the cities, there came a man full of leprosy. And when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and begged him, “Lord, if you will, you can make me clean.”

¹³ And Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him, saying, “I will; be clean.” And immediately the leprosy left him. ¹⁴ And he charged him to tell no one, but “go and show yourself to the priest, and make an offering for your cleansing, as Moses commanded, for a proof to them.”

¹⁵ But now even more the report about him went abroad, and great crowds gathered to hear him and to be healed of their infirmities. ¹⁶ But he would withdraw to desolate places and pray.

What’s the heart of the human problem? And how can it be solved?

1. The background: Leprosy teaches us that

Sin spoils, spreads, separates, soils and sticks

2. The message: Jesus can cleanse and restore us

3. The outbox: this is what Jesus wants the world to know!

COFFEE QUESTIONS:

If you ask people in London “What’s the heart of the human problem? And how can it be solved?” what kinds of answers might you hear?

The Bible’s answer to what’s wrong with the world is well-developed and makes sense of the world we live in. What do you find persuasive about it?

In what ways does this passage simply communicate the Bible’s main message? How has it helped you grow in your appreciation of Jesus?
